AB 1077 (Holden): Hosting Board Meetings through Telephone or Computer – a "Mixed Bag" for Mutual Water Companies

AB 1077, a bill introduced by Assemblyman Chris Holden, would have required a mutual water company to allow any eligible person, who was unable to provide at least 24-hour notice to attend a board meeting, the ability to participate in the meeting by technology, via a telephone or computer.



Members of CalMutuals board of directors and staff met with the author of the legislation, Assemblyman Chris Holden, in Sacramento in early April to express concerns regarding the bill; most notably – the limited technological capabilities by some mutual water companies and the inability to monitor or verify who would have remote access to information discussed during the meeting.

The bill was amended to allow a mutual water company's board to choose the option to host its board meetings via a telephone or computer, if members are unable to meet in person, or to allow audience participation via such remote means.

The legislation *does not* require the use of such technology. However, once a board of directors chooses to host its board meetings through electronic means, the law requires that anyone listening to the meeting be allowed to make public comments and interact with the board. This requirement is exclusive to mutual water companies as cities, school boards and special districts are not required to allow public comments or interaction with the board when hosting their meetings via electronic means, a telephone or computer.

What does AB 1077 mean for your mutual water company?

AB 1077 is an in part reiteration of 2013 legislation (AB 240) which, among its provisions, requires mutual water companies to opening board of directors' meetings to specified "eligible persons." For more information on AB 240, <u>click here</u>.

For mutual water companies serving transient communities (i.e. vacation community), AB 1077 provides the ability to manage board affairs remotely. However, once a mutual water company opts to utilize the teleconferencing component made possible by AB 1077, additional components within the bill's language are triggered.

Those components include:

- Providing copies of all board meeting materials (minutes, budget, agenda, etc.) prior to the meeting, and;
- Allowing other eligible persons to participate in board matters.

Despite the permissive nature of AB 1077, CalMutuals recommends that mutual water companies closely review the ability to fulfill all requirements within the bill's language prior to utilizing remote communications to conduct board meetings.

DWR Presents Grant Program Guidelines

Free AB 54 Classes in English and Spanish
